We have one year old seedlings of the following:

Apricots

Sandcherries

Hazelnuts

Honeysuckles and Haskap

Nanking cherries –fruit good for eating fresh and processing. There are two types: the type from Brooks tends to have large fruit, the local type tends to have outstanding winter hardiness.

Plums, Asian (*Prunus salicina*) -fruit good for eating fresh and processing.

Plums, Wild (*Prunus nigra* and *Prunus americana*) –an excellent pollinizer for hybrid plums with fruit very good for jam and sauce.

Named cultivars that have been clonally propagated:

Ptitsin #3 plum

Ptitsin #5 plum

Borealis and other haskap and honeysuckle clones

Prices for seedlings: \$5 each for the first 5 plants; \$4 each for the next five plants; \$3 each for plants more than ten.

Prices for named cultivars: various prices from \$5 to \$10.
